Special Parent Information Night!

We invite parents to join us in the library on Tuesday April 25 at 6:30 for a very informative presentation from the **RCMP** - **Northern Alberta ICE unit.** The presentation is for parents only as the content is very sensitive in nature but we will provide childcare in a different room for children.

The internet has an integral role in everyone's lives, and when it comes to youth, their social lives exist largely in cyberspace. Throughout the course of the past three years and the Global Pandemic, Alberta has experienced a significant increase in cases of child exploitation on the internet. With more users online than ever before, and new apps and software being developed every day, it can be difficult for parents and teachers to keep on top of the latest trending platform. Advancements in technology are exciting and helpful, but it opens an ever-growing gap between the knowledge of that technology between youths and busy adults.

The Northern Alberta Internet Child Exploitation Unit investigates incidents of child luring, sextortion, possession, transmission, and the making of child pornography as well as internet-related voyeurism involving youth. This presentation will focus on education, prevention, and putting parents and teachers in a position to protect their children from online sexual exploitation. The presenters will discuss the role of ICE in Alberta, current applications and internet platforms, and additional resources which are available to parents so they will be able to better support healthy and productive online experiences for their children and teens.

New Programs at Graminia for the 2023-2024 School Year

Full Day Everyday Kindergarten!

We are excited to announce that Graminia School is planning to pilot an inquiry-nature based full-time (everyday, all day) Kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year. After consultation with our Early Learning Services Team and review of practices of other divisions similar to Parkland School Division, we plan to pilot a play-based, student-centered, full-day, everyday Kindergarten. Our full-day everyday program would be structured to focus on classroom learning and curricular outcomes of the kindergarten curriculum in the morning and the afternoon programming would be a student-led, nature based, inquiry learning model.

If you want to register your child for MyPath: Graminia, you must FIRST complete your registration for Graminia School confirming your child will be in gr 4-9 for the 2023-2024 school year and you must complete <u>the MyPath:Graminia Registration</u>. Once you have completed this registration, the MyPath Navigator and Connections for Learning team will be reaching out to confirm registration, complete the waiver forms and pay for the deposit. We will be accepting registrations until May 1, 2023. If there are too many registrations for the program, a random draw will be used to determine enrollment. If there are not enough registrations to make the program viable, we will cancel the program for the 2023-2024 school year. Confirmation of enrollment will be shared with parents and/or guardians by **May 5**.

Speech Support Through AHS

<u>Morning Breakfast</u> Program & Snack Shack

Our Breakfast Program is up and running in the Multipurpose Room starting at 7:35 every day. We also have a Snack Cooler that is available for students to grab a healthy snack at any point in the day. These programs are for everyone and anyone! Alberta Health Services is currently offering speech sound and fluency intervention for school aged children at no cost to families in the Queen Street Health Unit in Spruce Grove. The AHS SLPs have reported the school aged service is being underutilized in our area. Parents can self refer by calling the health unit directly at 780-342-1300 and selecting option #3.
